

- To identify gaps and challenges in the policy and to recommend suggestions for addressing them.





EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has felt the need to conduct Gender audit for understanding the gender discrimination and biases (if any) on the college campus. The Principal and Vice-Principal has realized that the gender policy should be work out to make the college campus gender bias free and safe to all genders. The practice which promotes gender equality are to be followed consciously and efforts are to be made to understand the gaps between what ideally thought for gender equality and the reality on college campus. The college campus should be safe and free to all genders. And hence, it was necessary to understand the attitudes of the college campus towards students of all the genders.

Gender equality is a systematic inclusion of all students and college staff experiences, and it needs. It is a process of incorporating gender just approach in all the levels such as governance, decision-making, policy, needs analysis, institutional offices and operating mechanisms, planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation in institutions so as to create an organization that is gender equitable. Gender analysis is an essential first step of collecting and analysing sex-disaggregated information in order to understand gender differences and how these differences may have an effect on different college policies

Gender audit is an evaluation process aimed at figuring out whether set policies or interventions are working in good way. It is an institution's self-assessment, monitoring and evaluation of college structural facilities and educational facilities. In the planning of the audit, an analysis was conducted to identify, evaluate the Gender issues. The analysis was based upon an examination of the policies, manuals, and standards that govern the gender sustainability, on data analysis, and on the results of google form based on gender equality questionnaire.





GENDER SENSITIVE FEATURES IN COLLEGE

Activities for Gender Sensitization In every corner of college system gender sensitive features are carefully observed. Gender equality has been kept updated by forming the committees like Anti-ragging, Redressal Cell for Women at work place and providing adequate facilities for girls and boys.

- 1) Safety Facilities: A) Entrance: For safety measurements for all students and to avoid chaotic situation a security is made available. B) Parking facility: A well observed separate parking for two wheelers and bicycles for all is one of the disciplines in our college. C] Study Room: Separate study (reading) room compartments in the library girls and boys. D] Book issuing schedules are laid down for issuing which marks discipline. E] Ladies Common Room and Wash Room: Ladies Common Room provision is made for girls. A notice board is placed in Ladies Common Room which displays notices specific for female students. Clean and hygiene Wash Rooms are available with ample water supply. Women faculty members take care of girls wherever necessary. Women faculty provides sanitary napkins if necessary and a Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine is also installed in ladies room, F] Drinking Water: A separate drinking Water facility is there for girls. G] Canteen: Canteen facility is available in campus. H] Health Camp: Every year Health camps & Blood donation camps are arranged by NSS & Students Development Council.
- 2) Anti-Ragging and Discipline Committee: The College publishes its regulations in prospectus as well as in college campus. Ragging is criminal offence and UGC has notified Regulations on curbing the means of Ragging in highly educational institutions in order to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging. The college has its Anti-Ragging and Discipline committee, as per the University guidelines. These committees are having female and male members.
- 3) NSS Unit: NSS unit has 150 volunteers, they are actively participating on various activities Every year a Special Winter Camp is organized to inculcate students with the importance of nature in rural areas. A Ladies teacher accompanies students on filed visits and NSS residential camp.





- 4) Students' Welfare Unit: This unit is responsible for spreading awareness among students regarding life values and learning various life skills. Counselling of students is done whenever required by teachers and professional counsellors. 'Mentor-Mentee' system has been introduced. Mentors motivate students to approach them for help and support of all kinds. In few instances, complicated cases have been referred to psychiatrists. Counsellors include lady teachers, which makes it easier for girls to express themselves freely.
- 5) Internal Complaint Committee (ICC)- ICC addresses the grievances, received from the ladies staff and students.
- 6) Women Development Cell- Women Development Cell (WDC) works to build gender sensitise atmosphere in campus. Programme like self-defence technique, Life Education Sessions, Legal and Sex Education are conducted by WDC. They are made aware issues like sexual harassment at working place, issues of transgender,




Chart 1: Faculty wise gender distribution in enrolment at graduation level




Chart 2: Faculty wise gender distribution in enrolment at post-graduation level




Chart 3: Category wise gender distribution




Chart-3 Staff wise gender distribution






Methodology

- 9) Each question analysed carefully and summarised.







Survey Results & Conclusions

- The respondents were from F.Y., S.Y., T.Y. classes of Arts, Science, Commerce & Management branches of the college






Question 1 - The college conducts gender sensitization program as part of curriculum

- While 14% (17) in 2020 while 14% (34) of the students in 2021were neutral









Question 2 - The college has set up Women Development Cell and Students are aware about the cell.

- 15% (18) in 2020 while 12% (30) of the students were neutral






Question 3 - The college has set up Grievance redressal cell and Students are aware about the cell.

- While 27% (33) in 2020 while 19% (47) of the students in 2021 were neutral









Question 4 - The classroom offers equal opportunities to all genders

- 6% (8) in 2020 while 12% (28) of the students in 2021 were neutral






Question 5 - The Library offers equal opportunities to all genders

- 7% (9) in 2020 while 11% (26) of the students were neutral








Question 6 - There is equal opportunities to all gender in every activity of college

- 10% (13) in 2020 while 9% (21) of the students were neutral (May be)




Question 7 - There is equal opportunities to all gender in sports and different intercollegiate competition of college

- 7% (9) in 2020 while 10% (24) of the students in 2021 were neutral (May be)









Question 8 - There is equal opportunities to all gender for participation in NSS

- 15% (18) in 2020 while 9% (21) of the students in 2021 were neutral (May be)






Question 9 - There is equal opportunities to all genders for free and fair expression of ideas

- While 13% (10) in 2020 while 12% (29) of the students in 2021 were neutral









Question 10 - There is equal opportunities to all genders for assessment of academic performance

- While 8% (10) in 2020 while 6% (10) of the students in 2021 were neutral






Question 11 - The College is celebrating women awareness program for the academic year on regular basis

- While 17% (21) in 2020 while 15% (37) of the students in 2021 were neutral








Question 12 - The college has set up different common rooms for boys and girls the students are aware of their common rooms

- While 12% (15) in 2020 while 17% (42) of the students in 2021 were neutral (May be)




Question 13 - The college library has set up different reading rooms for boys and girls, the students are aware of their common rooms


- 87% (107) in 2020 while 84% (205) of the students in 2021 gave positive response (Yes)

- While 4% (5) in 2020 while 8% (20) of the students in 2021 were neutral








- Question 14 The college arrange workshop for sexual harassment on students and employees

 While 19% (23) in 2020 while 19% (45) of the students in 2021 were neutral






- Question 15 There are female staff in the non-teaching staff and provide proper assistance

- While 16% (20) in 2020 while 13% (33) of the students in 2021 were neutral









Question 16 - The college conduct various informative guidance lectures to know the various law and rights of people

- While 10% (12) in 2020 while 13% (32) of the students in 2021 were neutral






- Question 17 The college has good atmosphere for all gender and student feel safe in the campus

Recommendations

Based on the survey results following are the recommendations:

- Majority of the students (above 80%) are aware about the gender sensitization and various activities carried out related to it like Women development cell and events regarding the same
- Students feel that irrespective of gender they have equal opportunity to access various facilities and extracurricular activities in the College
- Students are aware that there is no gender bias in college for expressing themselves or to achieve their academic goals
- Knowledge of availability of grievance redressal cell have improved from 69% in 2020 to 77% in 2021, while awareness of sexual harassment workshops in the college is low and reduced from 70% in 2020 to 68% in 2021, so effective communication is needed to make everyone aware about it







Conclusion:

In the above gender audit analysis the institution strictly follows gender equality on campus. We follow gender equality in admissions, scholarships, library facilities, teaching learning process, practical, hostel admissions and at all other required levels. The institution strictly observes all rules implementations of gender issues in the college facilities.
